## **Foreign Language Sequence Options**

All students who did not complete four (4) years of the same foreign language in high school must complete a foreign language to graduate from the College of Journalism and Mass Communications (CoJMC).

## You have two (2) options to choose from to fulfill this graduation requirement.

If you would like to continue with the **same language you learned in high school**, you will need to take the *Modern Language Placement Exam* to be placed in the appropriate course level based on your current proficiency in the language. You would start in the class level determined by your score, and then you must complete through the 202 level class.

If you would like to **start a new language**, then you would automatically start in the 101 level class. You would only be required to take 101 and 102 of the new language.
